Eligibility

Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA)

Candidates who have passed (Eligible for Higher Studies) the HSE of the Kerala State Board of Higher Secondary Examination or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto, with not less than 45% is eligible for admissions. A concession of 5% will be given to OBC/OEC candidates. The SC/ST candidates need get only a pass.

B. Com.

Candidates who have passed (Eligible for Higher Studies) the HSE of the Kerala State Board of Higher Secondary Examination or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto with at least one commerce subject are eligible for admissions to the B.Com degree course. Candidates who have not studied commerce subject for Higher Secondary or an equivalent examination not less than 45% marks are also eligible. A concession of 5% will be given to OBC/OEC candidates. The SC/ST candidates need get only a pass.

Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA)

Candidates who have passed (Eligible for Higher Studies) the HSE of the Kerala State Board of Higher Secondary Examination or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto with Mathematics/Computer/Science/Computer Application/Information Technology/Informatics Practice/Informatics/ Additional Mathematics as one of the subjects are eligible for admissions

B.Sc. Artificial Intelligence

Candidates who have passed (Eligible for Higher Studies) the HSE of the Kerala State Board of Higher Secondary Examination or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto with

Mathematics/ Computer Science/Computer Application/ Information Technology/Informatics Practice/Informatics/ Additional Mathematics as one of the subjects are eligible for admissions

Ragging and use of mobile phones are prohibited in this institution as per G.O.Rt.No.346/05 Dated 01-03-2005 and Kerala Ragging Prohibition Act 1998 respectively.

Aviation (4 Semesters)

Full stack java with mean stack

This course is organized by the Department of Computer Applications. Full Stack Java and MEAN development program is designed to create high productive software development talents. The program covers Core Java, Front-End Technologies, SQL & NOSQL Databases, Java Frameworks such as Spring Boot, Hibernate, Node & Angular. This is an intense training program to provide hands-on experience on the relevant technologies.

Google associate cloud engineer

This course is organized by the Department of Computer Applications. It provides learners with the training required to set up a cloud solution environment, plan and configure a cloud solution, deploy and implement a cloud solution, ensure successful operation of a cloud solution, and configure access and security.

Digital Banking

The course is intended to provide practicing bankers with a sound foundation in digital banking products such as cards, ATMs, mobile and internet banking and Point of Sale (PoS). This would equip them in rendering improved customer service.

GST using Tally

The course has modules from fundamentals of GST to practical of GST using Tally. The programme is enriched with varied business scenarios, charts, observations, solved illustrations, and practice scenarios on Tally. It is structured in a blended format which gives learners the flexibility to learn at their own pace while being guided by experts.

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COLLEGE RULES & REGULATIONS

Code Of Conduct For Students

1. The working hours of college are from 9.30 a.m. to 3.30 p.m. on all working days. Students should not come late for their lectures. At the stroke of the second bell at 9.25 a.m.in the morning, students shall stand up for the Prayer song.
2. Students should wear the uniform, complete with their identity Tags, on all working days. Identity tags are compulsory.
3. Student Unions Have No Right to Start Union Activities in College Campus and Political activities are completely banned in the College campus. Students should not bring any banner, flag, board, notice, pamphlet or other such material into the College campus for promoting any political activity.
4. All strikes, Demonstrations, Agitations, Dharna, Gherao, Hartals either directly by students or through the member students of any political party, are banned in the College campus.
5. No incident should create any obstruction in the running of the institution as well as the ingress and egress of the teachers, staff, and students of the college.
6. Students are prohibited from taking part in any meeting in the College campus unless such meetings are convened and organized by the College Authorities.
7. Ragging is strictly prohibited. Any instance of ragging will immediately be reported to the Police. Offenders will be dismissed from the Institution forthwith.
8. Students are expected to greet their teachers when they meet them for the first time in the day. Their language and behavior should be always polite. When teachers enter classes, students should stand up until the teachers indicate that they can resume their seats.
9. Misbehavior to members of the opposite sex or staff members will be considered as serious cases of misconduct.

10. Students should make it a habit to peruse the General Notice Board for fresh information.
11. Students should realize that 'Cleanliness is next to Godliness'. They must endeavor to keep their class rooms and surroundings clean. The properties of the College must be properly taken care of by them. If students cause damage to the College property deliberately, compensation as decided by the authorities will have to be paid by them.
12. Smoking and drinking alcoholic beverages and use of narcotics of any form are strictly banned in the Campus. Recalcitrant behavior in the class room or campus, general neglect of studies or duties assigned to them will be considered as serious offences.
13. Birthday celebrations or other festivities should not be conducted in the class rooms or campus during regular working hours.
14. Students are advised not to bring their outside friends to the institution during working hours or during the various programs conducted by the Institution, unless specifically permitted by the Principal.
15. Using mobile phones inside the classroom and library is strictly prohibited. Mobile phones should in silent mode inside the campus.
16. Valuables like gold ornaments etc. should not be brought to the Campus.
17. Students are prohibited from organizing any meetings. They must not collect any funds for whatever reason.
18. Students who wish to bring their vehicles (two- wheelers or four-wheelers) into the campus must strictly keep a speed limit of 25Km/hr in the Campus. Any vehicle exceeding the speed limit will be barred from the Campus. Students are expected to follow the normal regulations regarding helmets and seat belts.
19. Writing, sticking bands, bills, posters and disfiguring walls and the Laboratory rooms and doors are strictly prohibited. Unauthorized Flex, Banners, Placards and using crackers are totally banned in the campus.
20. Low waist pants are not permitted in the Campus.

Tests and Examinations

1. Students should take all the examinations and tests. Absence from a test will affect their sessional marks.
2. There will be monthly tests, series tests and model exam in each semester. Periodic assignments and seminars will also be conducted.

Students should note:

1. Monthly and Series tests will be based mainly on the modules covered during the period prior to the tests. The final test may include all the modules.
2. Non-submission of assignment will result in the reduction of sessional marks.
3. Progress reports will be sent to the parents. Marks will also be available online.
4. Open house will be conducted for parent-teacher interaction.
5. At the end of the Semester, students are required to obtain the “No Dues” form and submit it in the office before hall tickets are issued. The forms are available in the office.
6. The decision of the Academic Council on all matters related to sessional marks/examinations/tests will be final.
7. Students have to keep all the records related to their internal assessment and they have to submit all on demand.

Issue of certificates

1. No transfer certificate will be issued if there is an amount due to the college
2. The conduct certificate is a document of credit of one’s meritorious behavior. There should be a healthy competitive spirit among students to excel in their general conduct and character. Then it will be a matter of pride and pleasure to issue the certificate of conduct to the students.

RESOURCES AND SERVICES

Library

The college of advanced studies has a spacious and impressive Library, well- stocked with latest books in general management and all functional management subjects. In addition a good collection of books by reputed authors in general subjects and allied areas like Communication Skills, Economics, Legal Systems, Business Environment, Quantitative Methods and other foundation courses are also available. The Library has a vast collection of online and offline resources such as magazines, periodicals, national and international management journals and newspapers. The college of advanced studies to two well- known and top quality e- journals namely J- Gate (advanced studies) and ProQuest- Management. Adequate number of terminals for online reference of e- journals and internet access and reprographic facilities are also provided in the Library for the benefit of students and staff. The Library Reading Room can seat 60 students.

Directions for Library Use

1. All the students enrolled in the college and members of the staff working in the college are eligible to be members of the library.
- 2 **Functioning time** of the library is from **8.30 am to 4.30 pm**.
- 3 Students may borrow 2 books at a time. Books are issued for a time period of 10 days. A fine of Rs. 2/- will be levied per book, per day for delay in returning of the books. Students can renew the loan for 10 days on or before the first due date.
- 4 Faculties may borrow 4 books at a time for a period of three

months at a stretch. Thereafter, the books must be returned for re issue, if needed. Fine as applicable to students will be levied for delays in returning the books. However, teachers may keep text books with them for a period of 6 months or one semester at a stretch without fine.

- 5 Magazines will not be issued to the students. Faculties may borrow 2 back volumes for a period of 5 days.
- 6 Underlining/marking/tearing/folding of pages/defacing/damaging in any way of library books is strictly prohibited. Users indulging in such practices would be levied fine depending on the gravity of damage or marking.
- 7 The borrower has to make sure of '*no damage*' to books taken on loan before leaving the counter. Damage if any should be reported to the librarian and recorded. Otherwise the borrower shall be responsible for any damage, marking etc. detected after lending.
- 8 Exchange/Transfer or sub-lending of library books is strictly prohibited.
- 9 Books lost have to be replaced, or pay the current amount of the book.
- 10 If any book in a series/set is lost or damaged the borrower has to replace the entire set or pay three times the price of the whole set.
- 11 Users should leave their bags and personal belongings including personal books outside the library.
- 12 Strict silence should be maintained in the library.
- 13 Using mobile phones inside the library is strictly prohibited

HOSTEL

Twin-sharing accommodation facilities are available in the campus for girls. The rooms are furnished with cots and mattresses, a computer table, chairs, closets and shelves. All rooms have full-time Internet connectivity with direct lines to the main LAN. Housekeeping staff is available throughout to take care of cleaning the rooms, corridors, and rest rooms. Mess facilities with vegetarian and non-vegetarian

menu are available. There are also provisions for Indoor Games and Health Club Facilities (Gym) for body fitness at the hostel premises. Boys are permitted to be boarders and paying guest in recognized buildings in the college premises.

Computer Lab

The advanced studies has a modern Computer Lab designed to meet all the IT related needs of students. The Lab has 60 networked PCs with Wi- Fi access.

All the System and Application Software as per AICTE norms are provided. Internet facility is available throughout the camp
